On behalf of Project Sunshine's Board of Directors and our entire team, we are honored to share our 2025 Impact Report and to offer our deepest, most heartfelt gratitude to every volunteer, donor, and supporter who made this year possible.

This past year, our community reached new heights. Together, we served **266,527** children and families across **625** hospitals and healthcare facilities, and our more than **18,000** volunteers contributed **53,860** hours of compassionate service. These are more than numbers, they represent moments of laughter in a hospital room, a craft project that sparked creativity, a familiar face that reminded a child they are not alone.

Behind every visit and program is a story like this impactful moment from one of our volunteers. *"I brought hats for the kids to color. I could tell that one young boy in particular was excited about the craft, but he seemed to have a lot of anxiety when it came to interacting. As he was coloring his hat, he became more relaxed and he ended up drawing a really cool design that all the other kids loved. When I pointed it out, they all wanted him to demonstrate how he did it so they could copy it, and I could tell that that really boosted his confidence. He really opened up, and by the end of the group we were all chatting and laughing with him."* This is why we do what we do and why your support matters more than words can fully express.

Our Mission

To deliver the healing power of play to children with medical needs through trained and dedicated volunteers. Each year, millions of lives are disrupted by stress and anxiety from pediatric illness or injury. We partner with medical facilities across the United States and in three international locations (Canada, Israel, and Kenya) to meet the psychosocial and developmental needs of pediatric patients. Our programming supports these critical needs by providing opportunities for play and authentic engagement in the medical environment, restoring a crucial sense of normalcy for patients and their families.

Medical experts agree that play is essential to children’s development and well-being. Gerald M. Loughlin, MD, former Chair of the Department of Pediatrics at Weill Cornell Medicine and Pediatrician-in-Chief at NewYork-Presbyterian, and a board member of Project Sunshine, emphasized that play is critical for children’s mental health and socio-emotional development. The American Academy of Pediatrics even recommends that physicians “prescribe” play to every pediatric patient they treat.

“Play is fundamental to healthy childhood development,” said Dr. Loughlin. “It supports children’s emotional well-being, resilience, and social growth—especially when they are facing medical challenges. My hope is that programs like Project Sunshine’s can one day be incorporated into every medical facility serving pediatric patients. In the meantime, I encourage everyone to get out there and play—doctor’s orders!”

Project Sunshine understands that play helps children relax, be creative, and heal and is working diligently to expand our global reach.

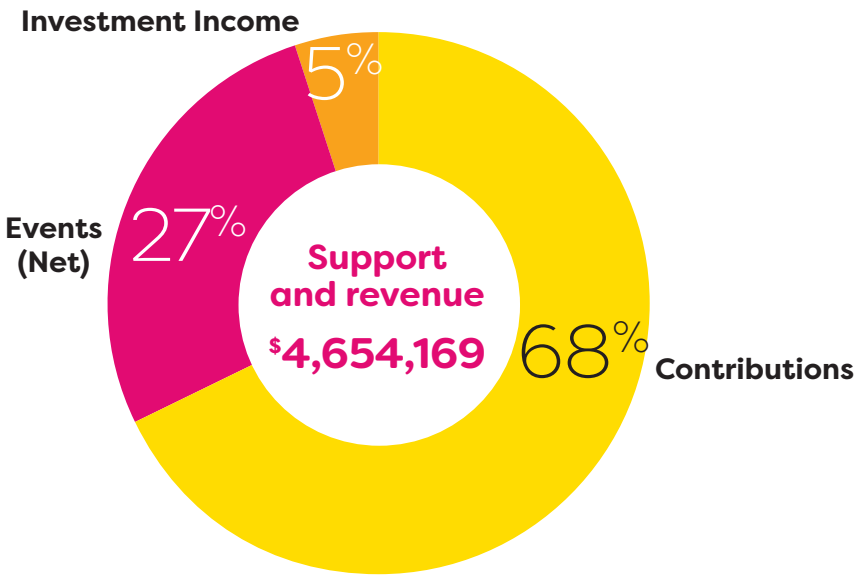

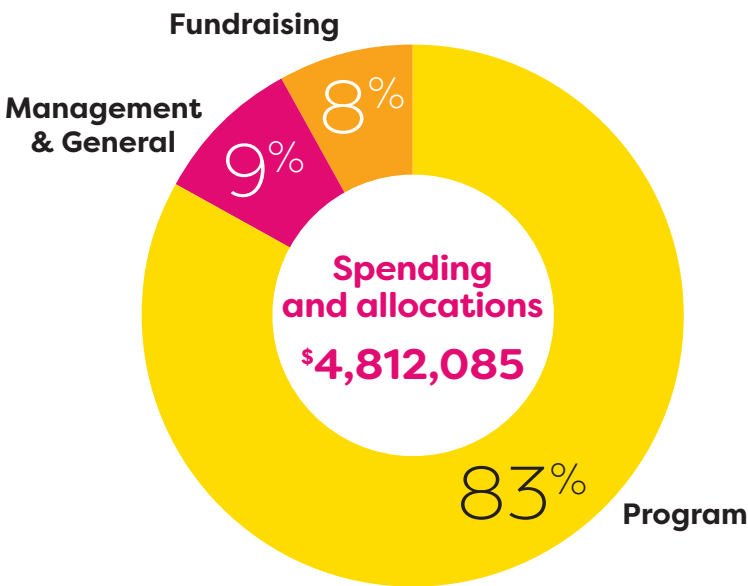

Project Sunshine delivers play through three signature programs that can be tailored to meet the unique needs of each patient. Whether it's through interactive play kits, bedside playtime, or exciting parties, our aim is to create memorable experiences that promote healing and happiness. We understand the importance of play in a medical setting, and our dedicated team works tirelessly to ensure that every child benefits from our programs.



Here to Play harnesses trained volunteers to facilitate arts and crafts activities with patients in-person at hospitals and clinics. This highly tailored program helps reduce stress, encourages creativity and socialization, fosters intellectual growth, and most importantly brings laughter and joy to families impacted by hospital stays.

TelePlay is Project Sunshine's virtual program and is a game changer for children and families managing chronic or rare illnesses or living in remote areas. TelePlay provides play through HIPAA-compliant video conferencing, allowing volunteers to engage with children in developmentally appropriate activities, helping to reduce isolation and build peer connections.

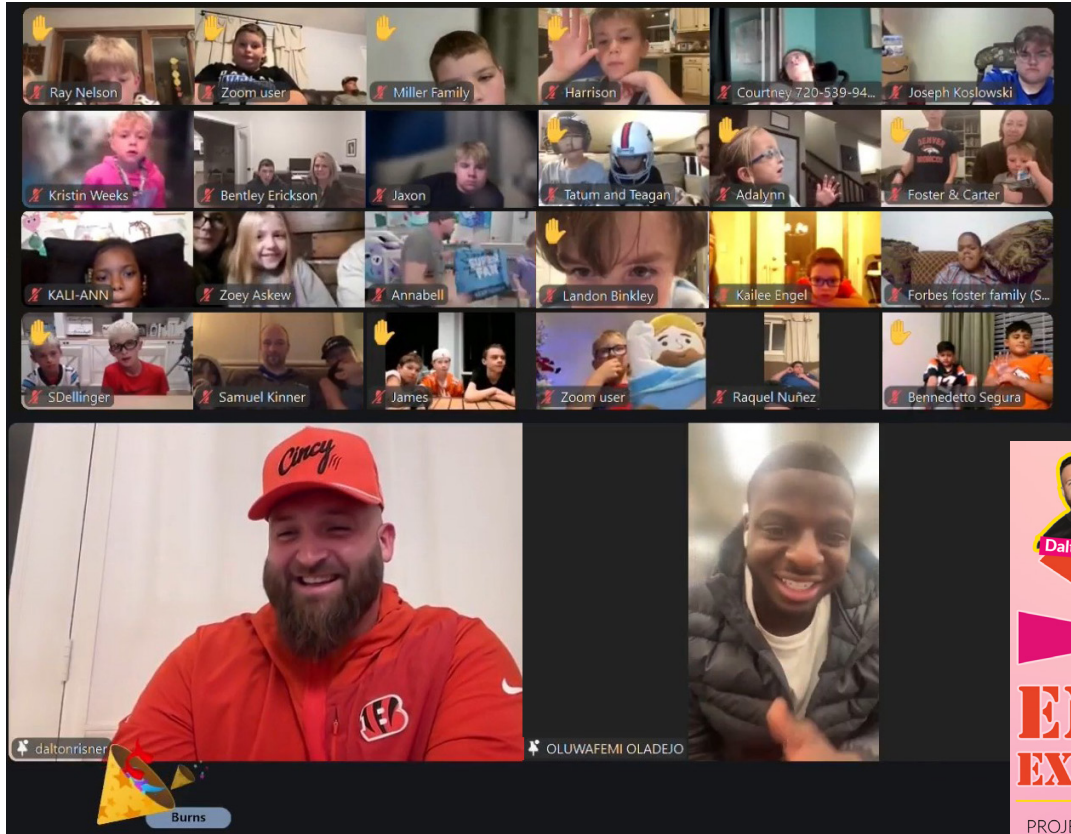

Our **Global** Impact

United States

In the U.S. alone, 1.3 million children are hospitalized annually, and 15 million children aged 6 - 17 live with chronic illness. These children experience stress and isolation as they navigate appointments, procedures, and missed school days. As their medical needs take center stage, and their interactions become centered around their conditions, these kids lose out on play, a key part of reaching developmental milestones, processing feelings, relieving stress, connecting with others, and just being a kid! That is why Project Sunshine delivers free, research-backed play programs to 191,439 children and families at 573 medical facilities in US every year through our signature programs.



Canada

Since 2006, Project Sunshine Canada has delivered Here to Play, TelePlay, and Kits for Play across more than 40 medical facilities. In partnership with Bryan College, whose student massage therapists contribute their time as part of their practicum training, Project Sunshine Canada introduced Wellness Zones to help reduce caregiver stress. In 2025, 18 chapters and 183 volunteers brought meaningful impact to 12,651 patients and families across the country.

Israel

Established in 2008, Project Sunshine Israel impacted more than 11,959 patients and families with over 60 volunteers at 6 partner facilities. Delivering in-patient play and literacy programs, they continue to operate despite the unrest in the region.

Kenya

Since 2006, Project Sunshine Kenya has served more than 50,478 children and families annually through health literacy, games, supplies, and hygiene programming. The Healthy Living Initiative connects remote communities through local health worker home visits, while the Clinic Based Program offers hygiene education, arts, tutoring, and healthy snacks. Each quarter, Project Sunshine Kenya partners with the Ministry of Health to bring health education and play to communities across the region.

“Our programs have a profound impact. Last year, we visited six orphanages and reached more than 500 children by bringing meaningful play opportunities and connection through our volunteers. We supported activities throughout the day and distributed food and clothing. These visits, like our other special events, have a lasting impact on the children, families, and broader community served by Bomu Hospital.”



Medical Facility Partners

Medical facilities offer clinical solutions but often lack resources for play-based programming. Project Sunshine operates in 48 out of the 50 states and launched 19 new volunteer chapters in 2025. We partner with Child Life Specialists and Clinicians to provide free arts and crafts materials and play-based programming.
